## Philips and Picker Medical Systems Formed In Joint Venture

The United States (US) Department of Justice has not opposed a joint venture of the medical divisions of the N.V. Philips' Gloeilampenfabrieken of The Netherlands and the General Electric Co., p.l.c., (GEC) of the United Kingdom. The new company, combining Philips Medical Systems Division and the GEC's medical subsidiary in the US, Picker International, will be called Philips and Picker Medical Systems. The company will be based in the greater New York area.

Frank A. Hopkins, chief executive officer of the new company, said that all existing products of both companies will be supported for the normal lifetime of each system.

# DOE Extends Brookhaven National Laboratory Contract

The United States (US) Department of Energy (DOE) has extended its contract with Associated Universities, Inc. (AUI) for the operation of the Brookhaven National Laboratory (BNL) in Upton, New York. The DOE's Chicago Operations Office negotiated the five-year extension of the current contract, which expired December 31, 1987, with AUI, a consortium of nine northeastern universities.

BNL, which employs approximately 3,200 persons, had a DOE opera-

ting budget for fiscal year 1987 of approximately \$162 million, with an additional \$42 million in construction and equipment funds. On-site administration of the operating contract with AUI is provided by DOE's Brookhaven Area Office, under the direction of Area Manager Jerry Bellows.

# SNM Technologists Offered Liability Insurance Plan
